General Info

Shotgun: Any of the 4 popular gauges of shotgun may be used. These are 12, 20, 28, and 410. The maximum number of shells that can be in the gun is 2. If we are shooting single targets then only 1 shell. Guns must be open in the case of double barrels or the action open in semi-autos. Guns may be rented at site but reservations are a must for them.

Skeet: 4 rounds of skeet at 25 shots per round. The best sized shot for skeet is #9. You will need extra shells of malfunction of guns or skeet machine #9 is optimum but shot sizes down to 7 ½ are acceptable. Shot size larger than less is NOT ALLOWED!

Trap: 4 rounds of trap at 25 shots per round. The best sized shot for trap is #8. You will need extra shells of malfunction of guns or skeet machine #8 is optimum but shot sizes down to 7 ½ are acceptable. Shot size larger than less is NOT ALLOWED!

Sporting Clays: A 100 round course with varying stations following NSCA rules with a 2-hour time limit

5 Stand: The sport of five-stand involves 5 shooters standing side-by-side, shooting at clay targets flying from one side or the other, springing straight into the air, rolling across the ground like a rabbit, soaring out from overhead or coming straight toward the shooter.

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Shooting Classifications

1. Youth Rookies: Age 11 and Under
 2. Youth Junior: Age 12-14
 3. Youth H.S.: 15-18
 4. Parent/Child: Child must be 18 or under
 5. College: 19-22
 6. Sportsman: Must not have participated in any organized clay target events
 7. League: Designed for the shooter that participates in club or league shooting activities that rewards. Would be trophies or medals only
 8. Open: For any shooter that is now or has ever participated in any NSSA, ATA, NSCA or any organized event that rewards winners with money or prizes.
 9. Women's Division
 10. Husband and Wife
- Medals: Gold, Silver and Bronze in each division:
Skeet, Trap, Clay and 5 Stand
- * Division must be declared before walking on course*



Driving Directions

Cherokee Rose: From Atlanta, Georgia and I-75/85 North Metro Areas:

Take I-75 South to Exit # 218 (Hwy. 20). Exit and turn right. Follow the signs for Sun City Peachtree. Continue towards Griffin (westbound) for 3 miles until reaching Rocky Creek Rd, just after Mile Marker 14. Turn Left onto Rocky Creek Rd. Continue 6.4 miles through two stop signs until reaching the traffic light at Baptist Camp Rd. (across from the Sun City waterfall on your left). Turn right onto Baptist Camp. Continue for .4 mile. The main entrance to Cherokee Rose will be on the right.

Alternate Route from Atlanta: Take Hwy. 41 South towards Griffin, Georgia; Upon reaching Birdie Rd. (approximately five miles South of Atlanta Motor Speedway), turn left; Continue through four-way stop, (Birdie Rd. then becomes Baptist Camp Rd.) straight ahead for approximately two (2) miles. The Rose will be on the left.

From Augusta and I-20 East Areas:

Take I-20 and proceed Westbound until reaching the 2nd Greensboro, Georgia Exit; Take Hwy. 44 to Eatonton; Take Hwy. 16 to Monticello and then continue on Hwy. 16 to Jackson, Georgia; Continue on Hwy. 16 until you reach the intersection of Hwy. 16 and I-75; Continue on Hwy. 16 through this intersection for .5 mile; Turn right on Jackson Rd. and continue for approximately 7 miles until reaching the four-way stop; Turn right on Hwy 155 and continue for 1.4 miles to Teamon Rd.; Turn left on Teamon Rd. for 3.9 miles; Turn left on Jordan Hill Rd. for .8 mile to Baptist Camp Rd.; Turn right on Baptist Camp Rd. for .3 mile. The main entrance will be on the right.

Tom Lowe:

We are located on the Southwest side of Atlanta approximately 20 minutes from downtown. From Interstate 285 take Exit 2. Go west on Camp Creek Parkway (away from airport) for 3.6 miles. Take a left on Merk Rd. We are less than a mile down Merk Rd. on the left.

AGREEMENT, RELEASE AND WAIVER OF LIABILITY

In consideration of being permitted to participate in or assisting others in participation in the Georgia Games Championships ("Championships")/District Sports Festivals, and related events and activities, on behalf of myself, or a minor child or ward, heir, next of kin, personal representative, successor or assign;

- (1) I ACKNOWLEDGE, UNDERSTAND AND DECLARE THAT:
 - (a) To the best of my knowledge, I am in GOOD PHYSICAL CONDITION and have no disease or injury that would be aggravated by participating in activities related to the Championships;
 - (b) Participating or assisting other in participating in the Championships may involve RISK OF INJURY TO ME, INCLUDING DEATH, LOSS OR DAMAGE TO ME OR MY PROPERTY, or other consequences, which might result not only from my own actions, in actions or negligence but also the actions, in actions or negligence of others, the rules play, or the conditions of the premises or of any equipment used;
 - (c) There may be OTHER RISKS not known or not reasonably foreseeable; and Understanding All of the Above,
- (2) I ASSUME ALL OF THE ABOVE RISKS AND RELEASE, WAIVE, DISCHARGE, HOLD HARMLESS, INDEMNIFY AND COVENANT NOT TO SUE:
 - (a) The State of Georgia or any of its agencies, District Sports Festivals, the Georgia State Games Commission, the Georgia Sports Foundations, its Commissioners, its Board of Directors, its employees, agents, volunteers, coaches, trainers, or officials affiliated with their programs;
 - (b) Any affiliated subsidiary, successor, organization, or related companies or businesses, other participants, participating or sponsoring municipalities, governmental agencies, international organizations, agencies, sponsors, or advertisers, the respective administrators, officers, directors, agents, representatives, employees, or volunteers of such entities or organizations;
 - (c) The National Congress of State Games (NCSG), the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) and/or their respective representatives, officers, directors, employees, agents, successors and assigns;
 - (d) Owners, lessors and lessees, and Lake Oconee Shooting Club of premises used to conduct the Games FROM ANY AND ALL LIABILITY FOR INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, LOSS OR DAMAGE TO PERSON OR PROPERTY, OR ANY OTHER CONSEQUENCE in connection with entry in or arising out of participation in, performance in or lack of performance in, including travel en route to and from the Championships.
- (3) I AGREE THAT:
 - (a) Prior to participating as an athlete, I, or in the case of a minor, a parent or guardian, will INSPECT the facilities and equipment to be used, and if I believe same to be unsafe, I will immediately REPORT such condition(s) to the athletic coach, supervisor or official connected with the Championships of same and either DECLINE TO PARTICIPATE or ASSUME THE RISK of participating;
 - (b) I will ALLOW my PHOTOGRAPH, PICTURE or LIKENESS and/or VOICE to APPEAR in any official documentary, promotional (including and all advertisements), television, radio or film coverage of the Championships, WITHOUT COMPENSATION.
- (4) I CONSENT TO:
 - (a) ALL EMERGENCY MEDICAL TREATMENT as may be deemed appropriate under existing circumstances by medical personnel or personnel associated with the Championships. I HAVE READ THIS FORM IN ITS ENTIRETY AND HAVE PROVIDED TRUTHFUL INFORMATION.

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Georgia State Games – Developed to promote “grassroots” amateur sports and an improved quality of life, the Georgia State Games attracts athletes from a variety of backgrounds, ages and skill levels. Each year the Georgia Games continues to develop programs that fit the athletic and lifestyle needs of the Georgia public. As a member of the National Congress of State Games (NCSG), which is a community based, multi-sport member of the United States Olympic Committee (USOC), the Georgia Games is committed to enhance and promote participation in amateur sports.

Scholastic Sports Olympiad- A 42 sport, statewide, competition between all the middle/high schools in the state of Georgia, in all classifications. 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place schools, in each classification, receive a sports development grant.

NATIONALS - Every two years, 40 State Games come together as one to participate in a national competition, the State Games of America. All medal winners from State Games programs are eligible to compete. For more information, visit www.stategames.org

About the Georgia Games Championships – The Georgia Games Championships is a sports festival created for Georgia’s amateur athletes. Patterned after the Summer Olympics, the 2010 Championships will consist of 40 sports providing Georgia’s amateur athletes, of all ages and skill levels, a meaningful opportunity to participate in a true amateur sport competition.

Who Can Compete – All residents of Georgia who have lived in the state for at least 30 days prior to the date of competition for their sport are eligible if they meet the requirements specified by that sport. Georgia residents attending school or serving in the military in other states are also eligible. Residents of South Carolina and Tennessee are invited to participate as well.

How To Enter – NEW ONLINE REGISTRATION! Visit our website www.georgiagames.org to register online and receive a discount. Entry forms may be obtained by visiting our web site or by calling 770-528-3580. Participants are encouraged to note deadlines and register early for all competitions. A signed agreement, release and waiver of liability and payment of an entry fee are required in order to compete.

Refund Policy – REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN UNDER THE FOLLOWING CIRCUMSTANCES **ONLY**:

Entry received after maximum numbers of teams or individuals are bracketed.

Insufficient number of teams or individuals entered.

Entry received from a non-qualified athlete.

Insurance – *Insurance is the responsibility of each participant.* In some instances, the National Governing Body (NGB), which sanctions an event, may have secondary coverage. Medical aid will be available in the event of an emergency, injury or illness. Preparation for competition, such as taping, will not be provided.

Governing Body Registration/Membership – NGB registration requirements vary between sports. Please check your sport event information for details.

Number of Sports Entered - You may enter as many sports as you wish, as long as the events are not held at conflicting times. It is the athlete’s responsibility to make sure there are no schedule conflicts in the sports he/she enters.

Awards – All participants will receive an official Georgia Games Championships commemorative T-shirt. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to the first three places. With the inclusion of out-of-state athletes, no Georgian will be displaced for a medal. See your Event Director with any questions regarding this information. The Georgia Games Sportsmanship Award will be presented to the male and female in each sport who best exemplifies the positive attributes of a model competitor. Additionally, one male and one female athlete from the pool of Sportsmanship Award winners will be nominated for the State Games Athlete of the Year Award.

Organizers – The Georgia State Games and the Georgia Games staff, assisted by thousands of volunteers, carry out the various tasks associated with the execution of the Georgia Games Championships.



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Georgia Games Scholastic Sports Olympiad
